

Good afternoon everyone,

A busy, hard working first couple of weeks has gone in the blink of an eye. As promised, below is a brief guide to our learning this half term:

- English will be first be based on the Victorian fiction book 'Street Child' studying characterisation and using expanded noun phrases for effect before we study the atmospheric poem 'The Highwayman' by Alfred Noyes.
- Year 6 Maths lessons will cover place value of digits to 10 million then move on to recapping the formal written methods for the 4 number operations. Year 5 cover the same objectives to 1 million and simpler strategies for the formal written methods.
- In common with all other schools in WeST MAT, we follow a scheme called 'Opening Worlds for our Geography, History and RE teaching. In Geography we are learning about The Rhine River and The Mediterranean, in History we will find out about the Roman Republic and in RE the topic is Christianity and the family of Jesus.
- Our Science is learning about how we classify living things; we're finding out about the Swedish scientist Carl Linnaeus, looking at how we can sort organisms before creating our own branching databases.
- The ART topic this half term is called 'Making my voice heard'. This unit focuses on developing pupils' skills in using different art styles, exploring effects with tools, understanding and applying chiaroscuro, and creating symbolic and expressive drawings.
- PE lessons will focus on fitness and stamina through our running sessions on Mondays and we will start with football and then move on to tag rugby to develop team game skills
- Computing will teach the children how search engines work and how results are ranked and can be refined.
- PSHE starts with a being me unit focussed on celebrating each individual, setting goals and understanding the rights that different people are entitled to.

We also have a number of trips throughout the year. This half term we will be going to Morwellham Quay to find out about how the Victorians lived, to inspire us in our English writing. The year 6 children will walk down to the leisure centre in Ivybridge for a Junior Life Skills session and hopefully have Bikeability training in December. More information on these trips will be available nearer the time.
